

# Gender and Equity

Population of Kassala state




Population within study area

## **Objective**



The expected outcome will be improved performance of water management projects and systems, while strengthening the position of rural women and men or any other disadvantaged groups.

# Major recommended activities:

- A) Upstream: Rural Kassala and Kassala localities
- Small livestock diary and milk processing (Build capacity on milk products handling, reservation, storage, nutrition, extension and awareness services)
- Promote forestry with managed revegetation (In collaboration with Forests National Corporation)
- B) Downstream: Rural Aroma and North Delta localities
- 1. Improving small ruminants and poultry
- 2. Promote forestry with managed revegetation
